I. Reason for Referral/Critical Issues: Pt is a 2 month old female with retinal hemorrhages and bilateral subdural hematomas. Child Protection Team was consulted due to concern for non-accidental trauma. 3200 was filed and the assigned Protective Services worker for Livingston County is Mark Wheeler 517-915-8833. CPT SW and Dr. Mohr met with parents separately on 3/27/14 to obtain the following information. Please see SCAN note from Dr. Mohr for detailed history.

II. Assessment: Parents are married and live in Brighton with pt. This is the first child for both parents. Mom was employed as a nurse at St. Joe's but recently resigned so she could stay home with pt full-time. Dad is a pilot for Delta Airlines. Dad's family lives in Colorado and Mom's family lives in New York. Parents describe strong support from their church and have had many visitors from their church during this admission.

Parents both give history that Dad was watching pt on 3/15/14 while mom ran some errands. Dad says as he reached to hang up the cell phone, and pt lunged out of his hands while he was burping her. Dad thinks pt may have hurt her head when he grabbed her to prevent her from falling onto the coffee table. Mom reports pt had bruises and marks on her face when she returned. Parents say pt vomited during church the next day and got progressively worse, so parents took her to St. Joe's ED that night and again the next day. It was reportedly thought that pt had Noravirus and was sent home. Parents report on 3/18/14, after returning home from the walk-in clinic, dad noted pt was pale, limp and her eyes rolled back, so they called 911 and pt was brought to Mott. Pt was discharged on 3/24/14 but returned later that night and was re-admitted.

Parents report they are the only caregivers. Mom denies any feelings of depression, but does believe she is more anxious than most moms due to her nursing background and fear of pt getting sick. Dad describes himself as a "recovered alcoholic". He says he got a DUI in 2008 and has remained sober since that time. Parents deny any alcohol or drug use. Parents deny any mental illness in their families. They deny any history of abuse as children. Parents deny any domestic violence.

PS worker for Washtenaw County, Joyce Mansfield, interviewed parents at the hospital on 3/27/14. The case has been transferred to Livingston County who plans to involve Brighton Police Department. Mark Wheeler, PS, spoke with parents over the phone on this date and discussed a safety plan with parents that parents may only visit pt if a third party is in the room with them. The third party may be any adult the parents choose. Parents may also visit if nursing or other staff member is in the room, but staff is not expected to stay longer than needed in order to supervise parents. If parents are noted to be alone in the room with pt, they should be asked to leave until Monday morning when PS worker can meet with them. Parents plan to go home tonight to sleep and return early tomorrow morning. They have a friend from church who plans to spend the night at pt bedside.

III. Interventions:

- Filed 3200 with Central Intake, Protective Services.
- Case coordination with PS worker.
- Provided supportive involvement to parents.
- Collaborated with medical team, nursing and SW.
