Information: The subject being tested is a 38-year-old male who is presently under investigation with law enforcement and Child Protective Services. At issue is the health of his two month old daughter (at the time of the incident) Naomi. On March 16, 2014, Naomi looked pale and began to vomit. The subject and his wife contacted the baby's pediatrician due to their concerns. After an examination, it was believed the child was being abused and authorities were contacted. Both parents denied causing any injuries to Naomi.

During the medical exam by doctors at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor Michigan, the subject was asked if he can recall any possible injuries to the child. The report contains the following statement: "Yesterday afternoon, there was an episode where Naomi was sitting in her dad's lap and she slipped off his lap. He caught her with his palm on her face about half way to the ground; she did not hit her head on the ground and did not have any loss of consciousness or change in her behavior."

Arrangement: The test was completed at the law office of Kronzek & Cronkright, located at 420 S. Waverly Rd., Lansing, MI 48917. The subject was advised of his rights as required in Public Acts of 1972 and Amendments (Michigan Polygraph Laws). The subject also signed permission forms which states that he volunteered to take the polygraph test.

Procedure: A Lafayette 4000 Computerized Polygraph Instrument was utilized during the test. The instrument digitally registers changes in blood pressure rate, strength of pulse beat, galvanic skin response, and respiratory patterns. A minimum of three (3) polygraph charts was completed utilizing a Zone of Comparison Technique.

THE EXAMINEE WAS ASKED THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS PERTINENT TO THE ABOVE MENTIONED INCIDENT AND GAVE THE FOLLOWING RESPONSES.

Test One

Relevant Issue Test Questions:

- 1: Were your statements on March 16th at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital accurate?

 Answer-YES
- 2: Are your comments as noted in the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital report on March 16th truthful? **Answer-YES**
- When you told the doctors at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital about the incident on March 15th, were you truthful? Answer- YES

Test Two

Relevant Issue Test Questions:

- 1: Since Naomi's birth, have there been injuries to her that have not been reported?

 Answer- NO
- 2: Since her birth, has Naomi experienced physical trauma that has not been reported?

 Answer- NO
- 3: Other than the March 15th event, are you aware of any other injuries to Naomi? **Answer-NO**
